### **Payment Methods**

To further assist families with payments, three payment options have been developed:

- Full amount by the beginning of Term 1.
- Payment by instalments through CompassPay.
- Other payment arrangements, including individual payment plans, eg CentrePay via Centrelink.

Parents/Guardians will be able to make payments by Cash, EFTPOS and CompassPay.

### Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis.

- Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.
- All claims for a refund must be in writing and addressed to the Business Manager.
- **NO** cash refunds will be given.
- Refunds will be made via Direct Credit or, a credit placed on the family account if preferred.

### FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

### **PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS**

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

### **Curriculum Contributions**



Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

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State Government Education and Training

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES
